MEDIA ENDOWMENT FOR INVESTIGATIVE JOURNALISTS

From year two of the project, we began the endowment for investigative journalists across all tiers of media in Nigeria. The aim was to empower select journalists through a competitive bidding process to apply for grants of up to N500, 000 to do investigative stories on the four themes of the project which are: POWER, EDUCATION, HEALTH and TAXATION and the stories are to be investigated and reported from the six project states of SCRAP-C.

Believing that the media, being the most significant force in the public sphere, is the most important and viable stakeholder to blow the lid on corruption, telling the story of the social cost of corruption in Nigeria. The engagement with the media was to write one investigative story/produce an investigative programme on issues around the realities of the relationship between moral and infrastructural decay and corruption in Nigeria.

SELECTION OF JOURNALISTS

A call for proposal was sent to the journalists through all SCRAP-C social media handles; through journalists' platforms, directly to media houses social media handles and to the editors of the mainstream media in Nigeria.

Selection was usually done by a team comprising of seasoned investigative journalists from CCSI assisted by ACTIONAID officers. Selected journalists are spread around the four themes and through the six project states.

CRITERIA FOR STORIES

- The story will detail how one or more specific cases of corruption have negatively affected the lives of Nigerians, deepened social and infrastructural decay and have negatively impacted the mindset of people.
- The story must detail the negative impact the act(s) of corruption has had on the lives of real, individual people with quotes and relevant images.
- The story must be investigative and make determined efforts to identify what or who is responsible for the act(s) of corruption and what has or has not been done to hold this person/organization/ agency to account.
- The story must shun support for any political party, partisan political statements, religious orientation and any other tendentious orientation.
- The story must avoid libelous claims, character assassination statements and strictly conform with all the ethics of journalism and media practice.
- The sponsoring media organisation must be committed to publishing or airing the story.

IMPACTS

In the whole, 29 journalists across the print and online media were endowed to report on corruption during the process of the project. Aside from blowing the lid on concealed infractions, journalists using the Freedom of Information Act (FoIA) and employing undercover activities were able to point out various abandoned projects passed off as executed. This led many of the contractors and agencies to return to the site to finish the projects. Also, Lagos State House of Assembly has set up a probe panel to look into some of our reporters findings.

The stories must meet our strict standards of objectivity, clarity, good use of pictures, truthfulness and accuracy. The stories must also meet the following standards:

Call for Story Pitch on corruption in four sectors (Education, Health, Power, and Tax Administration) in any of SCRAP-C Ibom, Borno, Enugu, Kaduna, Kano, and Lagos) in Nigeria.

POWER

1. The story will detail on how one or more specific cases, corruption has negatively affected the lives of Nigerians and stalled development. 2. The story must be accurate and backed by hard evidence

3. For broadcast journalists, a reasonable level of pictorial evidence must be provided

4. The story must detail real people's lived reality with quotes and relevant images. A multimedia approach to the story for online and print media is paramount.

5. The story must shun support for any political party, partisan political statements, religious orientation and any other tendentious orientation. 6. The story must avoid libellous claims, character assassination statements and strictly conform with all the ethics of journalism and media practice.

7. Your media organisation must be committed to publishing or airing the story.

8. The investigation/production of the story must be concluded and published/aired not later than December 30th, 2018. Kindly note that the submission of pitches will then be followed by a selection process. Successful applicants will be supported to up to Five Hundred Thousand Naira (N500,000). These stories, after their publication in your different mediums, may be published in other forms by ActionAid Nigeria and other consortium partners including Centre for Democracy and Development (CDD) and Centre for

Communication and Social Impact (CCSI) strictly for illustration, with credit given to the Writer. All story ideas must be submitted with a detailed budget.
